Public Opinion of Taxpayer Collection of Union Dues

Voters overwhelming think taxpayer resources should not be used for political purposes. From July 4-5, 2013, Magellan Strategies polled 760 likely Pennsylvania voters. The margin of error for statewide results is 3.55%.

Voters, overall, have a positive view of labor unions.¹

Despite this, nearly 80% of voters say unions should not be able to use taxpayer-funded resources to collect their dues, but should collect dues from their members directly. This view transcends all regions, party identification, and includes 75% of union members.²
