Support Candidates Who Support Public Education

We the People. PSEA members just like YOU get to decide which candidates are most supportive of our schools, our students, and our profession.

PSEA's Political Action Committee for Education (PSEA-PACE) is made up of members just like YOU. They interview candidates, look at their records, and assess the strength of a candidate's support for public education.

PSEA-PACE asks the question: "Does this candidate support public education, our schools, and our students?"

If PSEA-PACE Board members answer YES, a candidate gets PSEA's recommendation.

hurt people like us and the students we serve.
