

Governor Corbett's Education Budget: A shameful free-fall risks years of academic progress and the future of our students.

Fewer teachers, staff, and programs. Increased class sizes, resulting in far less individualized attention for students. Cuts to tutoring programs. Cuts to art and music. Cuts to all-day kindergarten.

You and your students are living this story every day because of the \$860 million cuts imposed on our schools by Governor Corbett's first budget. And there is no relief in sight; he has just released his new budget proposal, further threatening academic quality and risking our students' futures (read Voice articles for details).

Pennsylvanians agree money matters: Public Education is a wise investment. Students, families, and communities deserve better.

- 95% believe all students are legally entitled to the opportunity to receive a quality education;
- 88% believe state government has a responsibility to ensure adequate funding for all school districts so students in all areas of the state, regardless of the wealth of their local school districts, have an opportunity to learn and succeed;
- 82% say it is the responsibility of our state government to adequately fund school districts in both good and poor economic times even if it means increased taxes or cuts to other state programs.

These statistics are among the results of research conducted by Susquehanna Polling and Research and released in November 2011 by the Education Policy and Leadership Council, www.eplc.org.
